A: The processed venison is collected from the processor by a nonprofit community food bank, pantry or shelter working in coordination with the processor. If a specific processor needs a nonprofit community food bank, pantry or shelter to work with, locations can be provided through the MSAH. This way, deer donated and processed by a specific processor helps the community around them.

A 2018 FEEDING AMERICA study for Michigan showed that the food insecurity rate for Children under the age of 18 years was at 16.3% OR 356,930 Children throughout all of Michigan's counties have a limited supply to nourishment.
